



# GRACE BRETHREN SUMMER PROGRAM GUIDE 2010

## INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the Summer Programs at Grace Brethren Junior / Senior High School. Grace Brethren Junior / Senior High School is a Christian, coeducational College Preparatory school that offers a diversity of co and extra curricular programs. As a discipleship school, we place at the center the desire to shepherd young men and women who have made a decision to follow Jesus Christ and make Him Lord of their lives. Because of this, all summer school courses at Grace Brethren are taught from a Christian worldview and rely on the validity of scripture to guide the determination of truth. Grace Brethren is a fully accredited institution, maintaining certifications from both The Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI).

## PROGRAM OFFERINGS

At Grace, there are four different types of summer programs. All course offerings are contingent upon enrollment and staffing. Each one is explained in detail below.

## **CONTINGENCY PROGRAMS**

Our contingency summer programs are required of incoming students who have been accepted to the school on a contingency basis. Contingency classes are typically offered in both Math and English and may be open to outside students depending upon the course. Students who need a contingency course will be notified of such in their acceptance packet.

## **REMEDIAL PROGRAMS (pages 2 through 8)**

Remedial courses are offered in most core subjects. Full time students at Grace Brethren are required to make up any semester F's from the regular school year prior to matriculating to the next grade level. Students who receive a semester D in either Spanish or Math are also required to make this grade up if they are moving on to the next highest level of this subject. Non-Grace Brethren students are welcomed to apply for remedial programs, but must be briefly interviewed by an administrator to determine the right course.

## **ENRICHMENT / FULL COURSE PROGRAMS (page 9&10)**

Again this year, Grace Brethren will be offering a select number of both enrichment and full course options. While enrichment options will vary on frequency of meetings, the full course offerings will meet all the same benchmarks as those taught during the regular school year. Full course offerings are accredited and UC approved where indicated. These courses are open to the general public.

## **MATH ENABLERS (page 11)**

Now in their third year, we are proud to offer Math enablers this summer for Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II. These two week intensive courses are intended for students who want to hit the ground running prior to entering one of these three subject areas. For the students who have taken advantage of these programs, they have been extremely helpful in starting off on the right foot in Mathematics. These are highly recommended for students who struggle in Math, but are good for anyone. These courses are open to the general public. Enrollment is limited.

## **REMEDIAL COURSE OFFERINGS**

**Course Title:** Bible 7

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This course will acquaint students with the first five books of the New Testament. These books are used to discuss the life of Christ and the effect of the Holy Spirit on the early church and the world. The students will learn about the history of the time and the impact of Christ in the lives of individuals. By studying these books, the students will be presented with the Gospel and with the implication of the Gospel in their every day lives. While learning what Jesus did, students will understand how they can be Christ-like in their relationships with parents, teachers, peers and non-Christians.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Bible 8

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This course will equip students with an understanding of true wisdom, where it comes from and what it looks like. The application of wisdom will be discussed as it relates to real life situations with family, peers and non-Christians. In addition, the students will trace various themes throughout the book of Proverbs in order to understand how the book deals with that theme comprehensively. Students will be required to analyze their own lives in an effort to apply what has been shown from the lives of biblical characters.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Early Hebrew History (9<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** A survey of each book of the Old Testament will be undertaken. Students will learn the theme for each book, the major figures and the geography of the Old Testament. In the process they will discuss how God revealed Himself to men, how the Israelites fared in their relationship with God and how individual men and women lived in relationship with God.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** New Testament Survey (10<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** The year begins with a study of the synoptic Gospels and Jesus' discourse at the Last Supper in the book of John. While studying Romans, a theological platform will be built which will frame the examination of the rest of the New Testament. Students will survey early church history in Acts and learn the location and background of the key cities of the Epistles they will be studying. Students will be encouraged to apply biblical truths that are reiterated throughout Paul's writings as well as those of the other New Testament authors.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Foundations of Christian Thought I (11<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** Students will have a general understanding of God and His attributes as well as how God reveals Himself in general and special revelation. An emphasis will be placed on arguments

for the existence of God and for the reliability of Scripture. After understanding the trustworthiness of Scripture, students will learn how to interpret the Bible the way it was meant to be read.

Students will also study God's special creation, humans. Our students will learn a biblical case as well as a logical case for why human lives are sacred regardless of age, gender or abilities.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Foundations of Christian Thought II (12<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This course continues the previous year's model and students will discuss spiritual warfare, dating and man's sinfulness. They will then learn who Jesus is as the perfect God-Man and discuss salvation and the many aspects of Jesus' work for us. The responsibility for members of Christ's body to the church will also be highlighted and students will contrast biblical Christianity with other religions.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** English 7

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** Literature includes story structure, poetry analysis and application. The Excellence in Writing program incorporates the principles of grammar and vocabulary with composition, style and structure. Classes include daily lessons in composition and grammar along with weekly vocabulary and literature lessons.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** English 8

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** Literature includes story structure, poetry types and terminology, and application. The Excellence in Writing program reviews and builds upon the principles of grammar and vocabulary with composition, style, and structure. Classes include daily lessons in composition and grammar along with bi-weekly vocabulary and periodic literature lessons with composition.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** American Literature

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** Literature includes the study of American literature from the 1600s to the 20<sup>th</sup> century. This survey is studied with an understanding of the times and circumstances of each period as well how each work reflects its author. Elements of prose and poetry learned in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade are reviewed and used in evaluating each work along with additional literary devices introduced by the text. Classes include daily lessons on American authors along with weekly vocabulary lessons and various writing assignments which includes nine essays.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** British Literature

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** Literature includes the study of British Literature from the Anglo-Saxon period to the 20<sup>th</sup> century. This survey is studied with an understanding of the times and circumstances of each period as well how each work reflects its author. Elements of

prose and poetry learned in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade are reviewed and used in evaluating each work along with additional literary devices introduced by the text. Classes include daily lessons on British authors along with weekly vocabulary lessons and various writing assignments which includes nine essays.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Spanish I

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** Students will recognize and employ a basic written and spoken vocabulary of the Spanish language as well as be able to perform grammatical functions. Students will learn conjugation of regular verbs in present, present progressive and preterit tense, subject pronouns, definite and indefinite articles, noun-adjective agreement, conjugation of selected irregular verbs, formation of negative sentences, possessive adjectives, and compare and contrast Hispanic and USA cultures and customs.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Spanish II

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This course includes review of correct conjugation of regular and irregular verbs; conjugation of regular and irregular verbs in present, preterit and imperfect; formation of present progressive tense; formal and informal commands and use of direct and indirect object pronouns. The grammar studied in the classroom will enable students to communicate beyond that learned in Spanish I. They will be able to speak in future, conditional and imperative tenses. At this point, the subjunctive

tense will be introduced. All students will investigate the political and religious situation of a Spanish speaking country.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Spanish III

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This course includes a review of correct conjugation of regular and irregular verbs in the present, preterit, imperfect, future and conditional tenses, correct use of commands, formal and informal, correct use of reflexive verbs, direct and indirect object pronouns and proper use of *por* vs. *para* and *pero* vs. *sino*. Literature reading, essay writing, dramatization and role playing will also be employed as well as oral drill and practice, Bible memorization and field trips. All classroom interaction is in Spanish.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** World Studies (7<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** In this course, students will study the major turning points that shaped the ancient world from the decline of the Middle Ages through the fall of the Soviet Union. Students will learn these major changes in light of the geography of the area and gain an understanding for how geography affected the course of history.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** American History (8<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** In this course, the students study American History beginning with the period of exploration, the American Revolution and will end with the Civil War and Reconstruction.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Geography (9<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This course is designed to introduce students to both physical and cultural geography around the world. While studying physical geography, the students will learn about geography as it relates to the entire world. While studying cultural geography, the students will be studying the cultures of the Middle East and Europe.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Ancient Civilizations (9<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** In this course, students study the major turning points that shaped the ancient world from the earliest civilizations to the rise of the Greeks and Romans. They will trace the rise of democratic ideas and develop an understanding of the historical roots of current world issues.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** World History and Cultures (10<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** In this course, students examine major turning points in shaping of the modern world, from the late fifteenth century to the present. The year begins with an introduction to current world issues and then continues with a focus on the expansion of the West and the growing interdependence of people and cultures throughout the world. This class will also include a review of the Protestant Reformation and moves forward to recent history and current events.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** United States History (11<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** In this class, economic, political, social, cultural, militaristic, intellectual history is examined from the perspective of God's sovereign intervention in the affairs of mankind. Students are expected to master major historical periods and pivotal events that shaped American history. These events include the Progressives, World Wars I and II, Great Depression, New Deal, Cold War and much more.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** United States Government

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This class builds upon the student's previous learning to deepen his or her understanding of the different functions and philosophies of government. The students will

study a detailed examination of federal governmental structure, the state structure and the role of the Christian citizen in it.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Foundations of Algebra I

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This course is designed to develop and solidify students' proficiency in basic mathematics (studying chapters 1-6 from Prentice Halls pre-algebra textbook) and prepare them for beginning algebra. Students will apply mathematical concepts learned while solving problems over a variety of disciplines.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Foundations of Algebra II

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** Foundations of Algebra II is a one-year course. It is the second course in the Foundations of Algebra over a two year sequence. Upon successfully completing this course, the student will be prepared to enter an Algebra I course. The course content includes, but is not limited to: Solving equations and inequalities, Linear Functions and Graphing, Spatial Thinking, Area and Volume, Right Triangles in Algebra, Data Analysis and Probability and Nonlinear Functions and Polynomials.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Algebra I

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** Students will be introduced to and become adept in using algebraic procedures and apply these concepts in mathematical problem solving. Concept recognition and skill application of algebraic properties and techniques will allow students to solve problems at a more abstract, higher cognitive level than simple arithmetic procedures used before. Students will be prepared for Geometry, Algebra II, and computer programming/computer applications that are predicated on knowledge of algebra.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Geometry

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** The study of Geometry includes points, lines, planes, angles, parallel lines and planes, congruent triangles and using congruent triangles in proofs, similar polygons, right triangles, the trigonometric functions (including the Law of Sines and the Law of Cosines), the Pythagorean Theorem, circles, constructions (if time permits) and loci, areas of plane figures, area and volumes of solids, coordinate geometry and a brief look at transformations.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Algebra II

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This course includes the following: a review of basic algebra, linear equations, systems of linear equations and inequalities, matrices and determinants, quadratic equations and parabolas, functions, powers, roots and radicals, exponential and logarithmic functions, polynomials and polynomial functions, rational functions, quadratic relations, sequences and series, trigonometric graphs, identities and equations and probability and statistics.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Life Science (7<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** This course includes study of the scientific method, classification and kingdoms. Students will also be introduced to the world of cells, plants, animals, human body and genetics including the use of a microscope and the dissection of a frog, earthworm and flower. They will learn different theories on creation and evolution and will be prepared to scientifically defend their beliefs. An introduction to weather and physical science is also part of this course.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

**Course Title:** Physical Science (8<sup>th</sup>)

**Course Type:** Remedial

**Description:** During this course students will become familiar with specific fundamental principles of chemistry, specifically, the nature of matter, how matter is classified and how matter interacts with other matter. Further, the basic physics principles of movement and mechanics, electricity and magnetism and wave theory (light, sound and the electromagnetic spectrum) are examined.

**Dates:** June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Times:** Two sessions daily: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00

**Cost:** \$385.00 per semester plus a \$40.00 registration fee.

## **Remedial Summer School Information GRACE BROTHERS JR/SR HIGH SCHOOL**

### **How does Summer School work?**

- Remedial Summer School lasts twenty days
- June 25 – July 23, Monday-Friday
- Two sessions are offered each day: 8:00-11:00 and 11:00-2:00
- Each session represents **one semester** of work
- A maximum of two semesters can be made up at summer school
- Students will be assigned what session they will be participating in.
- The grade earned in summer school will be viewed on transcripts alongside the previous grade.

### **Who needs Summer School?**

- Any student that has earned a grade of “F”, in either semester, in any course must retake that class prior to the start of the following school year
- Any student that earns a grade of “D” in either semester of Mathematics or Foreign Language must retake that semester prior to advancing to the next level
  - If a student earns a minimum percentage of 80% in the second semester of their particular mathematics or foreign language course, they can advance to the next level even if they earned a “D” during the first semester

### **How much does Summer School cost?**

- A \$40 non-refundable Registration Fee is required whether the student is taking one course or two.
- Each semester enrolled in costs \$385.
